

FAQ's about signarture canvas art

where and how is my canvas artwork made?

your canvas artwork is designed and produced in australia.

premium artist canvas is used for an authentic textured finish. state of the art print technology and UV resistant inks for the best possible print. the canvas is hand stretched onto extra wide, 40mm frames made from local plantation timber. the image fully wraps around the edges of the frame giving your canvas a contemporary "gallery-style" presentation. and it's finished off with our cool signartureTM branding.

what is meant by limited edition?

it means you're not buying a mass produced product but one with exclusivity. an edition limit of 150 applies to each colourway and size of each signartureTM design, and your piece will carry a hand signed, edition numbered label.

will it be ready to hang and could i change which way up i hang it?

your canvas is pre-strung, ready to hang. by default, it will be strung to hang as displayed. many designs also work well hung "the other way". if you would like your panoramic piece to hang vertically, or a rectangular piece to hang portrait style, after selecting the size you want, you have the option to enter this request within additional notes/instructions.

is it heavy?

our canvas artworks are considerably lighter than a similarly sized print under glass, not to mention less fragile. a considerable benefit during installation! use 3 kg per square metre as a guide.

can i hang my canvas artwork outside?

no. our artist canvas is a natural material that would be prone to mildew in damp environments. if you are looking for something to hang in your outdoor room, or indeed for a kitchen, bathroom, or a very humid climate, our perspex art is the answer!

how do i care for my canvas artwork?

your artwork needs to be handled with care, like any artwork. you should protect your canvas from water, extremes of temperature or humidity and direct sunlight during transit, storage and once installed.

whilst we use the best UV resistant inks, as with all printed materials, fading may occur if your canvas is displayed in continuous, strong sunlight.

you should be careful not to scuff or wet the artwork surface in any way. if leaning your artwork against an object, ensure this is by the frame, not the canvas itself to avoid distorting it.

occasional light dusting is the only cleaning recommended.
